SUMMARY OF THE SUPREME COUNCIL'S ACTIVITIES

During the period under review Members of the Supreme Council held five meetings of the 33°, conducted eleven meetings of the Higher Degrees (during which 597 Brethren were invested), installed eight Inspectors General, re-presented patents to twelve Inspectors General, consecrated three Chapters and visited the Districts of Berkshire, Cambridge & Isle of Ely, Cornwall, Derbyshire, Dorset, Durham, Dyfed, Gloucestershire & Herefordshire, Hampshire & Isle of Wight (Solent), Isle of Man, East Kent, North East Lancashire, South East Lancashire, South West Lancashire, Leicestershire & Rutland, Lincolnshire, Norfolk, Somerset, South Wales & Monmouthshire, Warwickshire, Worcestershire and Yorkshire, West Riding, as well as South Africa, North East and South Africa, Eastern Cape. The Supreme Council also received an inward visit from a representative of its unattached Chapter in Singapore. Visits were made to the Supreme Councils for Canada, Germany, Monaco and Switzerland and to the Norwegian Order of Freemasons. Members of the Supreme Council also attended the re-inauguration of the National Supreme Council of France. During the year, Members of the Supreme Councils for Canada, Germany, Ireland, Luxembourg and Switzerland attended meetings at Duke Street.

Meetings of Higher Degrees were held in Ghana, Nigeria and South Africa.

MEMBERSHIP STATISTICS

1024 candidates were Perfected in the year to 30th June 2018 compared with 987 in the previous year. The number of subscriptions received fell by 232 from last year to 26,773. The number of extant Chapters on 30th June 2018 was 913 with an average membership of 29. The average age of candidates for Perfection was 54.

- b) The Danish, Icelandic, Norwegian and Swedish Orders of Freemasons.

If you intend to visit a Chapter of a jurisdiction with which we are in amity, other than Scotland or Ireland, please obtain your Inspector General's approval in advance. The same applies if you wish to invite a member of another jurisdiction to visit your Chapter. If you wish to visit a Chapter under the Supreme Council for Ireland, you must contact the office of the Grand Secretary General beforehand. Communications between Supreme Councils are normally conducted by Grand Secretaries General. Brethren should therefore not attempt, without the Grand Secretary General's prior permission, to make direct contact with another jurisdiction.

ANNUAL DUES AND FEES

The Supreme Council has decided that the Annual Dues payable on 1st July 2019 will remain at £20.00 (plus VAT where applicable) for every subscribing member of each Chapter during all or part of the preceding year. Districts overseas (except where special arrangements apply) will continue to remit £16.00 per subscribing member, retaining the balance of £4.00 to help defray District costs.

DISTRICT/GROUP LEVIES

The maximum levy that each Inspector General is authorised to make on each subscribing member in his District/Group to help defray District/Group costs remains at £2.00.

QUALIFICATION FOR MEMBERSHIP

Brethren are reminded that all candidates for membership of the Ancient and Accepted Rite under our jurisdiction must profess the Trinitarian Christian faith and have been Master Masons **for at least one year** as set out in Rule 36(a)(ii) of the Rules of the Order. Proposers and seconders must check that their candidates are duly qualified.

BRETHREN MOVING HOMES TO ANOTHER DISTRICT

Any brother moving home to another District is strongly encouraged to advise his current Inspector General in order to receive assistance with an introduction to the Inspector General of his new District and to a Chapter near his new home.

DUAL ALLEGIANCE/AFFILIATION

Brethren are reminded that except in Cyprus, New Zealand and India, where specific arrangements are in force, dual allegiance is not permitted. Enquiries about this subject are to be submitted to the Grand Secretary General.

THE 2019 YEAR BOOK

The Supreme Council requires that a copy of the Year Book be given to every new member on his Perfection.

The Year Book provides information that cannot be included in Annual Circulars, such as detailed lists of members of the South African Branch Council, the 33°, Districts, Groups and Chapters. It also contains an Historical Section, with chronological lists of Members of the Supreme Council (and the offices they have held) and of other members of the 33°. It should also be noted, that in the light of recent data protection legislation, it has been decided that the contact details for Chapter Recorders will no longer be shown in the Year Book. Any brother seeking to contact or visit a Chapter should do so through the relevant District or Group Recorder. A copy of the Year Book, the cost of which is £12.00, is sent to each Chapter Recorder. You may order copies of the 2019 Year Book through your Recorder or directly from the Grand Secretary General's office (enclosing a cheque for £12.00 payable to 'Supreme Council').

HANDLING OF CHARITY MONIES

When a private Chapter intends to disburse its charitable monies, it is advised to ensure that this intention is circulated to all members of the Chapter prior to any disbursement. Chapters are reminded that Relief Chests may be set up with the Grand Charity to benefit from Gift Aid.

KING EDWARD VII CHAPTER OF IMPROVEMENT – DEMONSTRATIONS

In 2019, by permission of the Supreme Council, demonstrations of the 13th Degree will be given: on Monday 29th April at Freemasons' Hall, London; on Saturday 18th May at Freemasons' Hall, Worthing; on Saturday 1st June at Freemasons' Hall, Leicester; and on Saturday 13th July at The Shepherds, Carlisle.

In 2020, demonstrations of the 14th Degree will be given: on Monday 27th April at Freemasons' Hall, London; on Saturday 9th May at the Masonic Hall, Bolton; and on Saturday 6th June at Great Yarmouth Masonic Association, Great Yarmouth.
