SUMMARY OF THE SUPREME COUNCIL'S ACTIVITIES

During the period under review Members of the Supreme Council held three meetings of the 33° at which eight candidates were promoted, conducted five meetings of the Higher Degrees (during which 258 Brethren were invested), installed six Inspectors General, re-presented patents to eight Inspectors General (seven by proxy and one in person) and visited the Districts of: Baldwyn, Cambridge & Isle of Ely, Devonshire, Northamptonshire & Huntingdonshire, Somerset, South Wales & Monmouthshire, Warwickshire, Worcestershire and the St James and St Matthew Groups of London Chapters. One visit to foreign jurisdictions was conducted, for the inauguration of the Sovereign Grand Commander for Finland in Helsinki. During the year, Members of the Supreme Council for Germany and India and the Grand Master of the Honourable Fraternity of Ancient Freemasons attended meetings at Duke Street. Since July 2021 the Council has once again been meeting physically rather than virtually.

HIGHER DEGREES MEETINGS OVERSEAS

Higher Degrees Meetings were held in Ghana and Nigeria.

MEMBERSHIP STATISTICS

Owing to Covid-19, just 45 candidates were Perfected in the year to 30th June 2021 compared with 696 in the previous year and 972 in 2019. The number of subscriptions received fell by 1,587 to 23,821. The number of extant Chapters on 30th June 2021 was 899 with an average membership of 27. The average age of candidates for Perfection was 52.

RELATIONS WITH OTHER JURISDICTIONS

The Supreme Council is currently in amity with the following jurisdictions:

a) The Supreme Councils for the United States of America (the Southern Jurisdiction and the Northern Masonic Jurisdiction), Andorra, Argentina, Australia, Austria, Belgium, Bolivia, Brazil, Canada, Côte d'Ivoire, Croatia, Cuba, Cyprus, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Haiti, India, Ireland, Israel, Latvia, Luxembourg, Mauritius, the Netherlands, New Zealand, Panama, Philippines, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Russia, Scotland, Spain, South Africa, Switzerland, Togo, Turkey, Uruguay and Venezuela;

b) The Danish, Icelandic, Norwegian and Swedish Orders of Freemasons.

For the avoidance of doubt, please note that relations with any body styling itself the Supreme Council for Greece are currently suspended.

If you intend to visit a Chapter of a jurisdiction with which we are in amity, other than Scotland or Ireland, please obtain your Inspector General's approval in advance. This is particularly important in the case of territories, such as France, in which there are several Supreme Councils of which only one is considered regular. The same applies if you wish to invite a member of another jurisdiction to visit your Chapter. If you wish to visit a Chapter under the Supreme Council for Ireland, you must contact the office of the Grand Secretary General beforehand.

Communications between Supreme Councils are normally conducted by Grand Secretaries General. Brethren should therefore not attempt, without the Grand Secretary General's prior permission, to make direct contact with another jurisdiction.

The above is extracted from the accounts audited by haysmacintyre LLP, Chartered Accountants. If any member of the Order wishes to view the audited accounts, he may do so with prior notification to the office. Please note that owing to the Covid-19 pandemic, which once again greatly affected the financial year, the accounts show a surplus in funds, owing largely to: income from the Coronavirus Job Retention ('furlough') Scheme, grants from Westminster City Council, a rates holiday, committed (but deferred) expenditure and curtailed Council activities.

ANNUAL DUES AND FEES

The Supreme Council has decided that the Annual Dues payable on 1st July 2022 will once again remain at £20.00 (plus VAT where applicable) for every subscribing member of each Chapter during all or part of the preceding year. Districts overseas (except where special arrangements apply) will continue to remit £16.00 per subscribing member, retaining the balance of £4.00 to help defray District costs.

DISTRICT/GROUP LEVIES

The maximum levy that each Inspector General is authorised to make on each subscribing member in his District/Group to help defray District/Group costs remains at £2.00.

QUALIFICATION FOR MEMBERSHIP

Brethren are reminded that all candidates for membership of the Ancient and Accepted Rite under our jurisdiction must profess the Trinitarian Christian faith and have been Master Masons for at least one year as set out in Rule 36(a)(ii) of the Rules of the Order. Proposers and seconders must check that their candidates are duly qualified.

BRETHREN MOVING TO ANOTHER DISTRICT

Any member moving home to another District is strongly encouraged to advise his current Inspector General in order to receive assistance with an introduction to the Inspector General of his new District and to a Chapter near his new home.

DUAL ALLEGIANCE/AFFILIATION

Brethren are reminded that except in Cyprus, New Zealand and India, where specific arrangements are in force, allegiance to more than one Supreme Council is not permitted. Enquiries about this subject are to be submitted to the Grand Secretary General.

THE 2022 YEAR BOOK

The Supreme Council requires that a copy of the Year Book be given to every new member on his Perfection.

The Year Book provides information that cannot be included in Annual Circulars, such as detailed lists of members of the South African Branch Council, the 33°, Districts, Groups and Chapters. It also contains an Historical Section, with chronological lists of Members of the Supreme Council (and the offices they have held) and of other members of the 33°. It should also be noted, that in the light of recent data protection legislation, it has been decided that the contact details for Chapter Recorders will no longer be shown in the Year Book. Any member seeking to contact or visit a Chapter should do so through the relevant District or Group Recorder. A copy of the Year Book, the cost of which is £12, is sent to each Chapter Recorder. You may order copies of the 2022 Year Book through your Recorder or purchase one in person from Reception at 10 Duke Street St James's.
